3 STANDING ORDER No. 3

4 **ADMISSION TO PRACTICE**

5 Effective January 10, 2017

6 Section 113 of The Civil Code of the Fond du Lac Band of Lake Superior Chippewa
7 provides as follows:

8 ADMISSION TO PRACTICE. Any person admitted to practice and is [*sic*] in
9 good standing before the bar of any State or the District of Columbia shall be
10 deemed to be admitted to practice before the Fond du Lac Court. The Court
11 may, in its sound discretion, admit non-attorneys to practice before it, provided
12 that such individuals have demonstrated familiarity with the principles of
13 Indian law and conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the ethical
14 standards and rules of decorum of the Fond du Lac Court.

15 **1. Attorney Admission**


16 An attorney licensed in any State or the District of Columbia shall, upon his
17 or her first appearance in the Fond du Lac Tribal Court, submit an affidavit
18 providing the attorney's bar number in the jurisdiction where he or she is
19 licensed, and a statement that the attorney is in good standing in the
20 licensing jurisdiction.

21 **2. Non-attorney Admission**

22 A non-attorney seeking permission to practice before the Fond du Lac Tribal
23 Court shall submit a Petition for Admission to Practice. The Petition shall
24 describe the Petitioner's familiarity with the principles of Indian Law and
shall include the Petitioner's statement that, if admitted, the Petitioner will
conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the ethical standards and
rules of decorum of the Court.

In its sole discretion, the Court may hold a hearing on the Petition.
